Since forming in **Jan 2021**, Free the Fern has:

- organized **20** events
- received \$16,528 in funding from grants and donations.
- had 92 community volunteers
- accumulated 983 total volunteer hours
- removed 40 tonnes of invasives
- replanted over **700** native plants
