Indigenous Knowledge Sharing



Free the Fern was honoured to have Skwxwú7mesh educator, Matthew Williams, guide a Native Plant Walk on the Red Alder Trail on May 13, 2023.



17 participants gathered to learn from Matthew about native plants and their traditional uses for the $S\underline{k}\underline{w}\underline{x}\underline{w}$ u7mesh peoples.

Together, we learned that:

- When dogwood flowers bloom, it is a sign that Western red cedar bark is ready to be harvested.
- Oregon grape roots can be harvested to make a yellow dye, while the Oregon grape berries can be harvested to make a purple dye.
- Every Skwxwú7mesh family would have a unique pattern and colour that they would dye their Cedar hats and baskets., so that at gatherings everyone's hats could be told apart.
- Swordfern roots can be cooked like a potato, fern fronds can be woven into dip nets, and fern spores can be mixed with water into a paste and put on minor burns.

The walk concluded with fresh baked Bannock and jams prepared by Marge Wylie, an offspring of Chief Qua of the Tl'azt'en Nation ("people by the edge of the bay") and a residential school survivor.
