Light up the Night In Champlain Heights!



On Sunday, Dec 17, 2023, approximately 125 locals gathered for our <u>Light up the Night in Champlain Heights</u> event! This was our third annual lantern festival and proved to be our most successful event yet.

A month prior to the event, artist, <u>Joshua Ralph</u>, lead an <u>Artist Collaboration</u>, bringing together artists to help build lanterns to display along the Red Alder Trail.



Then, on Dec 9, artist, <u>Kiki Nombrado</u>, and Free the Fern Executive Director, <u>Grace Nombrado</u>, led two free <u>public lantern building sessions</u>. Local citizens of all ages gathered to make globe & jar lanterns to carry at our lantern procession.



On Sunday, Dec 17, 2023, 13 volunteers gathered at 3pm to help with lantern set-up. Together we hung jar lanterns with macrame string and displayed tissue paper lanterns along the trail.



Many community volunteers also delivered homemade cookies and helped heating up hot chocolate to serve at the event.



At 6:30pm, local citizens gathered just outside the Douglas Fir Teaching Garden with the Carnival Band, who led a procession in a loop through the Red Alder trail. As we walked, there was only a brief sprinkle of rain, which didn't damper the spirits of those gathered. Free the Fern Executive Director, Grace Nombrado, made an appearance as a rainbow fairy and artist and board director, Anne Banner, wore her handmade owl costume. After the procession, everyone enjoyed hot chocolate and a variety of fresh baked cookies.



Neighbourhood Matching Fund

We are excited to announce that Free the Fern has been approved for our second Neighbourhood Matching Fund from the City of Vancouver. Last year we received funding to support the creation of our <u>Native Food Forest</u>. This year, we have received funding to support our Healing Forest Project. In 2024, we will be partnering with indigenous artists and knowledge sharers to create carved seating, signage, and free public events centred around the <u>Douglas Fir Teaching Garden</u>, which recently was designated by the David Suzuki Foundation as a <u>Healing Forest</u>. Cornerstone Parks

In August of 2023, Free the Fern was invited to become a <u>Cornerstone Park</u> and receive funding from <u>Park People</u> to support our stewardship effort. At the end of 2023, Park People offered to extend funding support to Free the Fern for the next 18 months! The Cornerstone Parks program is Canada's only national network dedicated to maximising the impact and influence of Canada's large urban parks, including Stanley Park (Vancouver), High Park Nature Centre (Toronto), Darlington Ecological Corridor (Montreal) and more! Funding support has allowed Free the Fern to hire our Executive Director, Grace Nombrado, and offer free community walks and workshops into 2024. We look forward to all we can accomplish with the support of Park People!
