


As part of our <u>Healing Forest</u> project 2024, we have partnered with Coast Salish artist, <u>Andrea Fritz</u> to create a beautiful fern image.



We then printed this design onto sustainable cotton shirts and bags at local printers, Pressing Matters.

100% of all the funds raised from the sale of these shirts and bags will go to the <u>Urban Native Youth Association</u> (UNYA). The UNYA provides education, health, and housing support to Indigenous youth in Vancouver.

\$30 is the recommended donation for the shirts and **\$20** is recommended for the bags. Shirts and bags <u>can be ordered from us</u> and then picked up at a Free the Fern event or directly from our Executive Director in South East Vancouver. Payment is by cash or e-transfer.

In the words of Indigenous educator, Matthew Williams, "the Squamish people measure wealth not by how much they have, but by how much they can give." So, let's be generous and support those who are giving back so much in our community.

Park People - Cornerstone Parks

Free the Fern is grateful to <u>Park People</u> for their continued funding support. In January 2024, Free the Fern signed, along with local <u>Everett Crowley Park Committee</u>, to receive 18 months of continued funding support from the Park People <u>Cornerstone Parks Program</u>. The Cornerstone Parks program is Canada's only national network dedicated to maximising the impact and influence of Canada's large urban parks. Large urban green spaces across Canada, including Stanley Park (Vancouver), High Park Nature Centre (Toronto), and Darlington Ecological Corridor (Montreal), receive support through the program. This funding has allowed Free the Fern to hire an Executive Director, run free public walks and workshops, and continue the stewardship effort along the Champlain Heights Trail system.
