## Highlights of the Year



Aug 15, 2024 marked the end of our fiscal year and the beginning of a new fiscal year for Free the Fern. So, now is the perfect time to highlight some of the successes of our past year.

#### Over the past 12 months, Free the Fern:

- welcomed 615 event volunteers
- · dedicated **1,218** volunteer hours

- removed **50,960 L** of invasives (equal to 141 large city green bins!)
- planted **1,203** native plants
- moved **84** wheelbarrows of mulch

We also held our first ever <u>Native Plant Fundraiser</u> this April and successfully sold 288 native plants (worth \$2595.5) to the local community



Free the Fern participated in 36 local events, including:

- **11** Monthly Invasive Pulls
- <u>Food Forest Planting</u>, where we planted edible native plants and a pollinator garden.
- <u>Earth Fest</u> & <u>Champlain Heights Fair</u>, engaging with the public
- <u>3<sup>rd</sup> annual Light up the Night in Champlain Heights lantern festival</u>
- <u>Mushroom Walk</u> Cody Labossiere
- <u>Douglas Fir Watercolour Workshop</u> Marisa Phal



This year, through our Healing Forest Project, we partnered with Indigenous artists & knowledge-sharers, including:

- Tsatsu Stalqayu (Coastal Wolf Pack) danced at our Food Forest Planting (pictured)
- Rita Kompst (Musqueum nation) taught <u>Cedar Bracelet Weaving</u>
- Lori Snyder (Métis) prepared <u>Healing Salves</u>
- John Spence & son Koda (Squamish nation) carved a <u>Sacred Circle</u>
- Adrian Levesque (Cree Nation) shared about Two-Spirit identity at **<u>BioDIVERSITY</u>**
- Marge Wylie (Tl'azt'en nation) prepared her Bannock & jam at several of our events

This year, we strove to make the Douglas Fir Teaching Garden a truly welcoming and healing place, by adding new <u>seating and signage</u>.



We also began to engage with more children and youth this year:

• partnered with <u>Wild Outside for a Spring Break Invasive Pull</u>

- led several classroom <u>fieldtrips</u> & presentations
- welcomed <u>Fresh Roots Summer Camp</u> (Walk & Invasive Pull)

This fiscal year, we look forward to engaging with even more youth, through our Nature is for Everyone Project. Stay tuned for more info to come!

At our <u>Annual General Meeting</u> on Aug 31, we presented local Elder Marge Wylie with the title of <u>Elder in Residence</u>. Marge has been generous enough to share her story, culture, and bannock & jam with our community since 2022. Marge is from the Tl'azt'en Nation and a survivor of the Lejac residential school. We are honoured to have Marge as a neighbour and a friend.



## **Everett Crowley Park Liaison**

Also, at our <u>Annual General Meeting</u> on Aug 31, we presented local volunteer steward, Damian Assadi, with the title of Everett Crowley Park Liaison. Domain is a life-long resident of Champlain Heights, who has been committed to stewarding its green spaces. Damian served as Free the Fern board director from 2022-2024. He also is currently chair of the Everett Crowley Park Committee and board director for the Champlain Heights Community Association. As liaison, Domain will serve as a bridge between Free the Fern and the Everett Crowley Park Committee, sharing resources and partnering on events.



## **T-Shirt & Bag Fundraiser**

We are excited to announce that we have raised \$1,419 so far, as part of our Fern T-shirt & Bag fundraiser in support of the <u>Urban Native Youth Association</u> (UNYA). The fern design was created by Coast Salish artist, <u>Andrea Fritz</u> and printed on sustainable cotton at local Burnaby printers, <u>Pressing Matters</u>.
