Join us on Sunday, Dec 15 for our 4th annual <u>Light up the Night in Champlain Heights</u> event. We will be meeting at 6:30pm at the <u>Douglas Fir Teaching Garden</u> (just east of 3530 Swansacre) for a lantern procession. <u>The Carnival Band</u> will lead the way on a walk along the Red Alder Trail. There will be artist lanterns displayed along the way. We will then return for hot chocolate and cookies.



We have 10 partner artists helping to create lanterns for our event. On November 13, lead artist, <u>Joshua Ralph</u>, and the artists gathered for an <u>Artist Collaboration event</u>. Together, they learned lantern-making techniques and came up with ideas. The theme this year is "Connected Stories". Inspired by the many connected stories in nature, artists are busy constructing nature-themed lanterns, such as mushrooms and a Northern spotted owl.



We are also offering two free public lantern making workshops on Sunday, Dec 8, <u>Globe Lantern</u> making and <u>Ivy Basket Lanterns</u>. Both workshops are currently full, but a waitlist is available.

This year's Light up the Night in Champlain Heights festival is being organized in collaboration with the <u>Everett Crowley Park Committee</u>, with funding provided by <u>Neighbourhood Small Grants</u> and <u>Park People</u>.

Native Plant Guide

This year, Free the Fern Executive Director was happy to support the work of SFU students **Zoe Neudorf, Kate Ostby, Chloe Ross, Misho Rusev, Rhea Tailor** for their capstone project, Biodiversity Blanket: Simple Ways to Help Nature Thrive by Connecting Green Spaces in Vancouver City. As part of their research, the students conducted a native plant survey in Champlain Heights, with the support of Grace Nombrado. From this survey the students created a guide to native plant species. They encourage individuals and community projects to use this guide when deciding which native species to plant.



T-Shirt Fundraiser

Last call for our Fern Fundraiser! Our fundraiser will be closing on Dec 25, 2024. The fern design was created by Coast Salish artist, <u>Andrea Fritz</u> and printed on sustainable cotton at local Burnaby printers, <u>Pressing Matters</u>.
