Food Forest Updates!



On **Feb 14, 2025**, we were excited to have a surprise visit from renowned ethnobotonist, Nancy J Turner! Nancy's research on Indigenous wild cultivation systems inspired us to create our Free the Fern Food Forest in 2023. For many decades, Nancy has been researching the traditional "wild cultivation" methods of our first peoples. Historically, Coast Salish, Gitxan, and Ts'msyen peoples planted Food Forests or Forest Gardens beside village sites. It was an honour to be able to guide Nancy down the Red Alder Trail and show her our Free the Fern Food Forest. She was impressed by our community stewardship effort along the trail!



Free the Fern Executive Director, Grace Nombrado, was also invited to share about our Food Forest at the <u>ISCBC Invasives Forum 2025</u> conference on **February 24**. Grace led a "speedy session" at the conference, sharing how our Free the Fern volunteers cleared 14.8 cubic meters of invasives in 2023 before planting over 600 edible species to create a <u>Food Forest</u>.

This month, we also have begun a partnership with <u>VCC design students</u> to create an interpretive sign for the Free the Fern Food Forest. The sign will feature the history of the

space and images of some of the edible plants, including fruit & nut trees, berry shrubs, and ground cover.

We are excited to share about our Free the Fern Food Forest and inspire others to create food forests in their own area.
