# We have a Spring in our Step!



The Red flowering currant has just finished blooming, the Pacific bleeding hearts are starting to form seed pods, and the Oregon grape flowers are coming up bright and yellow! Spring has truly sprung!

We also have a new spring in our step, thanks to the success of our 2nd annual **Native Plant Sale** on **Sat**, **April 12**! We had a variety of shade and sun plants (purchased from <u>Nat's Nursery</u>), nature crafts, and books. Residents came from near and far. After factoring the cost of the plants, we raised a total of **\$1,272** (during the event and with post event plant sales)! These funds will go towards our Free the Fern stewardship effort. Thank you to everyone who came out to support us!



Then, on April 25, we welcomed a class of 21 grade 3 students from Sir William Osler Elementary. The students enjoyed a nature walk, pulled 720 L of invasive ivy, and planted 53 native plants along the Red Alder Trail! What a fantastic group of young stewards!



Then, the next day, on April 26, we participated in our 4th annual <u>Earth Fest at Everett</u> <u>Crowley Park</u>. The event was organized by the <u>Everett Crowley Park Committee</u>, and we

were grateful to be invited to share about our Free the Fern stewardship effort. We had 6 Free the Fern volunteers on hand under our bright green event tent. We sold a few more of our native plants (leftover from our plant sale) and a number of fabric bags and we invited the public to create flower crowns (using the ivy gathered by the grade 3 students).



In the afternoon of Earth Fest, we were honoured to welcome local artist, <u>Lorna Moffat</u>, to do outreach with the community. Lorna spoke with local residents and gathered phrases that describe our community. Lorna will write these on strips of upcycled fabric which will be braided together by local members of the community at our upcoming <u>Eco-Art Festival</u> on **June 28.** All these braids will then be woven together to create a "Braiding Community" art piece, which will be installed at the Champlain Heights Community Centre. Looking forward to creating an art piece that captures the uniqueness of our neighbourhood!

In April we were honoured to receive a <u>VanCity Community Branch Grant</u> of \$750, with funding offered from the Burnaby South Slope & Metrotown branches. We were grateful to the local natural menstrual product company, <u>Joni</u>, for offering us a very generous donation of **312 menstrual products**! These products will be offered free to the community in the washroom at our public events. This is part of our effort towards making our events more accessible.



### **Tree Inventory!**

We were honoured to have <u>Allison Luke</u>, Principal Instructor of the UBC Botanical Garden Horticulture Training Program, offering to assist us with a <u>Tree Inventory</u>. Consulting with our board, she chose to assess not only the trees in the Champlain Heights Trails, but also the adjacent complexes. She used existing lidar data and also spent 4 days measuring trees by hand (with her baby strapped to her in a carrier!) Allison is amazing! Check <u>here</u> to view the final report. **Eco-Art Fest** 

Save the Date for our <u>Eco-Art Fest on Saturday</u>, <u>June 28, 10am-2pm</u>. We will be welcoming 7 eco-artists to the Douglas Fir Teaching Garden to share their work with weaving, braiding, paper pulp and ink making. At the event, lead artist, <u>Lorna Moffat</u> will be creating a "Braiding Community" project, using upcycled fabrics, in partnership with the community, which will later be displayed at the Champlain Heights Community Centre. There will also be a drumming and dancing performance by <u>Tsatsu Stalqayu</u> (Coastal Wolf Pack) and complimentary bannock & jam, prepared by Elder in Residence, <u>Marge Wylie</u>.
